Dear Friends,

What a year! When I think about the past year, I think of change, of resilience, of expansion and potential. We have endured staffing changes from the great resignation, identifying how we engage with employees vs. how we want to engage with employees. We have utilized the Piper Fellowship and embarked upon learning that helped us identify our values as an organization and our purpose for engaging in this work, how to care for our community focusing on dealing with stress and burnout, how to utilize compassionate communication, and build systems that care for our staff and our community. The amazing opportunities through the Piper fellowship has helped us to innovatively lead and grow our organization, care for ourselves while focusing on growing our staff and infrastructure so the mantle of leadership can be shared while creating a culture of care that empowers our community to support each other.

In the last year, we piloted our Pre-K Music School, learning about best practices, and solidifying our vision for this work. We grew our leadership team with the addition of a full time registrar, two program managers, and our programs have now met (and in some cases exceeded) pre-pandemic numbers.

We have grown our teaching artist staff, created wellness benefits, and embarked upon professional development for those artists that are rooted in the values and culture that we have identified. We continue to learn and implement best practices in youth engagement and creative youth development, have an active student advisory council and are learning to integrate work force development as a part of our work with our young people in equitable ways. As a board, we have done a deep dive into our Diversity, Equity and Inclusion practices and identified areas to strengthen and areas to celebrate.

When we look to the future, we look towards sustainable growth, in order to help our community thrive. Last spring, we received funding through the Arizona Department of Education that will allow us to scholarship in nearly 300 students per year and adopt five high school music programs in need through September 2024. This will give us best practices on growth and scalability as we expand our program offerings and work more in-depth with our community partners to care for the families and our students in more holistic ways—not just teaching critical skills in music performance, but making sure they have enough to eat and working through youth development to give young people skills in social and emotional intelligence, resilience, grit, and increasing their capacity to excel in academics

As we prepare for our 25th year, we look to the future— to what role a community music school can play in the well being of the whole child and family, and help them not only meet their potential but live to their dreams, inspiring and transforming their lives. Thank you for being a part of our journey and helping our students soar!

We are so grateful to Ellen L. Schultz for her dedication to Early Childhood Music Learning! Ellen had a desire to help launch an early childhood music and movement program here in Phoenix. When her children were small, they had the good fortune of partaking in programs at the Music Settlement in Cleveland, Ohio and the experience was one full of joy and made a lasting impact on all of their lives. When PCM's Executive Director discovered that this was one of Ellen's dreams, fate was at work! PCM's Executive Director, Regina Nixon, is an early childhood music specialist who has been teaching programs from 6 months through kinder for the last 20 years. It has always been her hope that PCM

could have a robust Early Child hood program in their own facility. Why? How does this help achieve PCM's mission and vision? Our mission is to provide quality music education that is affordable and accessible and for so many families with young children, Pre Kinder Enrichment Programs are not readily available. PCM's vision is to be a leading provider in out of school time music education and what a better way to start than with a pre school experience? A way to fully have a music immersion program for 3-5 year olds and get them truly ready for classroom learning through the power of music while building music students of the future! Working with Ellen, we were inspired to work together to launch PCM's Early Childhood Music Academy!! A fully music immersive experience with a Parent/Child component, a Pre-K Music School experience, and other group learning experiences for 4-6 year olds. The goal? To have programs that are a fun, social, play based way to build music skills in young children through music learning games, music and movement activities, musical stories, music technology, direct instruction on classroom instruments, singing, and piano. Students create, collaborate and communicate! And...as they are learning music, they will be developing "extra" vitamins like small and gross motor skills, awareness of rhyming words, sight words, symbol and sound relationships, numeracy, letter recognition, patterning, sequencing and more— all through the power of MUSIC!

As we continue to grow and scale the good work we do, we are looking through this lens to inform our hiring practices, our systems, policies and procedures, and how we interact with each other on a daily basis.

Did you know?

That PCM is a Qualifying Charitable Organization for the Arizona Tax Credit.

How It Works: The state of Arizona offers its taxpayers the opportunity to make contributions to schools and non-profit organizations that reduce the amount of tax owed to the state or increase the amount of the taxpayer's refund, dollar-for-dollar. There is NO NET COST to the donor, and deserving individuals around the state benefit.

Married couples can give up to \$800 and single filers can give up to \$400. Make sure to fill out FORM 321 when preparing your taxes and use QCO Code 20958 to ensure your gift is credited back to you. This is a separate gift from the School Tax Credit and State of Arizona Foster Tax Credit.
