Dear Friends,



2023. Our 25th Anniversary. A quarter of a century is a long time. Maybe not in the history of the world, but certainly in my life (I've been with the organization since it's infancy) and in our community. For our organization, it took us from a seed of an idea to exploring new territories.

It finds us in the middle of a deep dive into our lifecycle, as a member of Atlas 9, a capacity building program funded through the Virginia G. Piper Charitable Trust and facilitated by the Non Profit Lifecycle Institute. It finds us determining where we are in growth and how we can be intentional about investing resources and effort in order to ensure long term sustainability and service that can continue to evolve to meet the needs of our community, our students and their families.

It finds us in year of learning and a year of planning. Of discovering best practices for community music schools facilitating arts and academic integration for early childhood, of planning new partnerships (Jazz at Lincoln Center's WeBop Program), and planning new program streams (Pre-K Music School) as a tuition based program. It's learning about and exploring getting proper licensure to become a licensed child care center for pre-kindergarten and kinder readiness programs.

It's a year for learning more about creative youth development and digging in deep to where we are on the scale for youth participation in each one of our programs and where our community thinks it should be.

It was a year of tremendous growth with the addition of our Learning Through Music program funded through the Arizona Department of Education Esser III Set Aside Funds that allowed us to pilot scalability to over 70 paid positions in the organization and with that growth, serve over 2,000 students with over 12,000 instructional hours. It's learning lessons that will help us, as this grant sunsets in September 2024, to really use our resources to get the biggest return on our investment with the best results in student learning, leadership, creativity and community.

We have a lot of work to do. And we have an incredible team to fulfill the vision and do the work, and that includes you.

The work we embark on is good work that fills the spirit and gives hope to those who help and life and joy to those who participate, but it's still a lot of work.

We thank each of you for your part—as student, parent, teacher, staff member, community member, advocate, ambassador and Investor—in making our community stronger and giving wings to the dreams of our students—one note at a time!

Welcome to the next 25 years. We invite you to join with us on this incredible journey in unleashing the power of music.

What is PCM's Learning Through Music Program?

This incredible two year program is funded by the Arizona Department of Education ESSER III Set Aside Funds through September 2024 and focuses on melding together three main components for students:

MUSIC EDUCATION + ACADEMIC INTEGRATION + CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT

There are a lot of parts and pieces to this tuition free program:

- Family classes for parents and students age 8 months to 5 years focusing on music competency and emergent literacy and numeracy skills.
- Pre-kindergarten music school that is integrated with arts and academics to get students kindergarten and classroom ready for students 3-5 years old.
- Block classes for Kindergarten through 2nd grade that focus on Music/ Movement, Music Fundamentals, and Skill Building for Success (gratitude, mindfulness, time management, reading, math, handwriting and more!)
- One class focusing on music creation (songwriting or audio production) and one private music lesson for students in 3rd-12th grades.
- Helping high school music programs in Title 1 areas build the competency of students post pandemic.
- ⇒ Tuition Free week long summer camps for 7 weeks.
- ⇒ All while serving free meals with our partner Kid's Café five days a week!

Qualifying families attend a title one school or qualify for free/reduced lunch at the school they attend, or don't have access to high quality music education through their regular school day process.



100% of students and parents surveyed said new knowledge in music was gained.

63% of students and parents surveyed said they used music as a way to interact with peers and socialize better.

90% of parents surveyed said their student used music as a way to gain confidence.

47% of parents surveyed said their student was reading more because of their involvement in this program.



Did you know?

That PCM is a Qualifying Charitable Organization for the Arizona Tax Credit.
